“Staying Connected” 7 – Sunday 3rd May 2020

Staying connected to God and each other while not meeting as church in the normal way

As we continue in these times, learning how to adjust, and trying to keep cheerful, we can dream a little, too, of when we might get back together in the building once more. It may seem a long way off still, but things won't always be like this. What would such worship look like for you...? [Do share any thoughts with me]

This week is the third of our series on the “I am” sayings of Jesus. Today, “I am the gate” (John 10:9) (The wider passage (John 10:1-10) details this more.



The gate in Jesus' illustration may not look quite like this one, but the point is being made that the way into freedom and good 'pasture' is through Him.

The contrast with the 'false shepherds' will be visited next week when we look at Jesus as the 'good shepherd'. For now, we just need to understand that entry into these 'abundant green fields' is through Jesus. As Christians we have been making use of this 'gate' for the whole basis of our lives. In Jesus we have salvation, which means tasting and enjoying wholeness of life now, not just eternal life for the future.

What might that mean in times of trouble and difficulty such as the global pandemic and the effects of lockdown? I think it means that the qualities of abundant life; of faith, hope and love, prevail even when the reality of suffering is all too evident. We have the wonderful privilege and gift of the Holy Spirit helping us and 'ministering' to our deepest needs. The love He gives is then reflected back to God and passed on to others in all sorts of ways. And it's all through Jesus.

It's not me, of course (!), but what a lovely ambition to seek to get to know Jesus more and more.
